§2. Money trail — campaign finance (OpenFEC, 5 cycles)

González Colón held the Resident Commissioner seat for eight years (2017–2025) and filed FEC disclosures across five cycles (2016–2024). The table below shows the full trajectory.

The 2020 cycle was her fundraising peak (\$1.31M), consistent with a competitive re-election year. The 2024 cycle reflects a winding-down period — she ran for Governor of PR, not for re-election to the House. Across all five cycles, individual contributions dominate at 89–96% of receipts; the PAC share is consistently in the \$30K–\$109K range. (Source: fec.gov/data/candidate/H6PR00082)

The Hispanic Leadership Trust appears 5 times in the top-20 list (\$25,400 total across 2023–2024). Majority Committee PAC's \$10,000 is the single largest contribution. All other entries are at or below the \$5,000 FEC per-election PAC limit. No individual contributions above the \$3,300 per-election limit appear in the top 20. §3. Money trail — Puerto Rico jurisdiction context

González Colón is now Governor of Puerto Rico. This section grounds her current office in the federal money flows that intersect with the jurisdiction she governs — *context, not performance*.

No anomalies detected in the public data we examined. As with the Pablo Hernández Rivera report, the PR-wide federal-contract concentration (Weston + Fluor = 26% of all obligated \$) is flagged on the [CivicaPR scorecard hub](#) as jurisdiction-level — not a personal-office anomaly for González Colón.

§6. Risk + limitations (the trust page)

What we looked at

- **FEC:** candidate_id H6PR00082 + principal committee C00588392, cycles 2016–2024 (5 cycles). Full receipts, disbursements, cash on hand, individual-vs-PAC mix. Top 20 contributors across all cycles.
- **USASpending:** 300 PR federal contracts worth \$8.31B, 151 unique recipients, 15 awarding agencies. Top 10 by total obligated.
- **OpenFEMA:** 20 PR disaster declarations with Public Assistance funding, \$1.12B federal PA share. Per-disaster deduped.
- **Census ACS 2022:** 78-muni aggregate + min/max for population, median income, poverty rate.
- **CivicaPR internal:** official roster, entity catalog, scorecard hub.

What we deliberately did NOT look at

- No private individual records (no credit headers, no address history, no employment verification beyond FEC disclosures).
- No Apollo person-level intel. Apollo ORG-level fields are in our public entity catalog only.
- No cell-phone, device, biometric, facial-recognition, or location data. *This is the surveillance red line.*
- No Puerto Rico commonwealth-agency operating budgets (CivicaPR does not hold that data).
- No social-media sentiment analysis, no in-flight campaign polling, no opposition-research material.
- No gubernatorial executive orders or policy analysis — this is a public-records diligence report, not a governance assessment.

Known gaps

- González Colón became Governor on January 2, 2025. No gubernatorial campaign finance data is available through OpenFEC — state-level campaign finance for PR is not part of the FEC dataset.
- Her FEC filings cover the Resident Commissioner office only. As of this report, her gubernatorial campaign has no federal filing requirement.
- The "FEMA under-/over-funding ratio" check is jurisdiction-only. PR FEMA context is provided to ground the office, not to attribute any official's advocacy.
- This report does not opine on guilt, intent, motive, or character. It summarizes public records and surfaces anomalies. The interpretive layer is the buyer's.
